Leah Jamieson is John A. Edwardson Dean of Engineering, Ransburg Distinguished Professor of Electrical and Computer Engineering at Purdue University, and holds a courtesy appointment in Purdue's School of Engineering Education.

Dr. Jamieson served as the 2007 President and CEO of the IEEE. She is co-founder and past director of the Engineering Projects in Community Service program (EPICS).

Dr. Jamieson has been recognized with the National Academy of Engineering's Gordon Prize for Innovation in Engineering and Technology Education, the NSF Director's Award for Distinguished Teaching Scholars, and the Anita Borg Institute's Women of Vision Award for Social Impact.

Dr. Jamieson served on the steering committee for the NAE report *Changing the Conversation: Developing Effective Messages for Improving Public Understanding of Engineering* and is co-chair of the ASEE project *Creating a Culture for Scholarly and Systematic Innovation in Engineering Education*.

Dr. Jamieson is a member of the National Academy of Engineering and a Fellow of the IEEE and IEC. She received her S.B. degree from M.I.T. and her Ph.D. from Princeton University.
